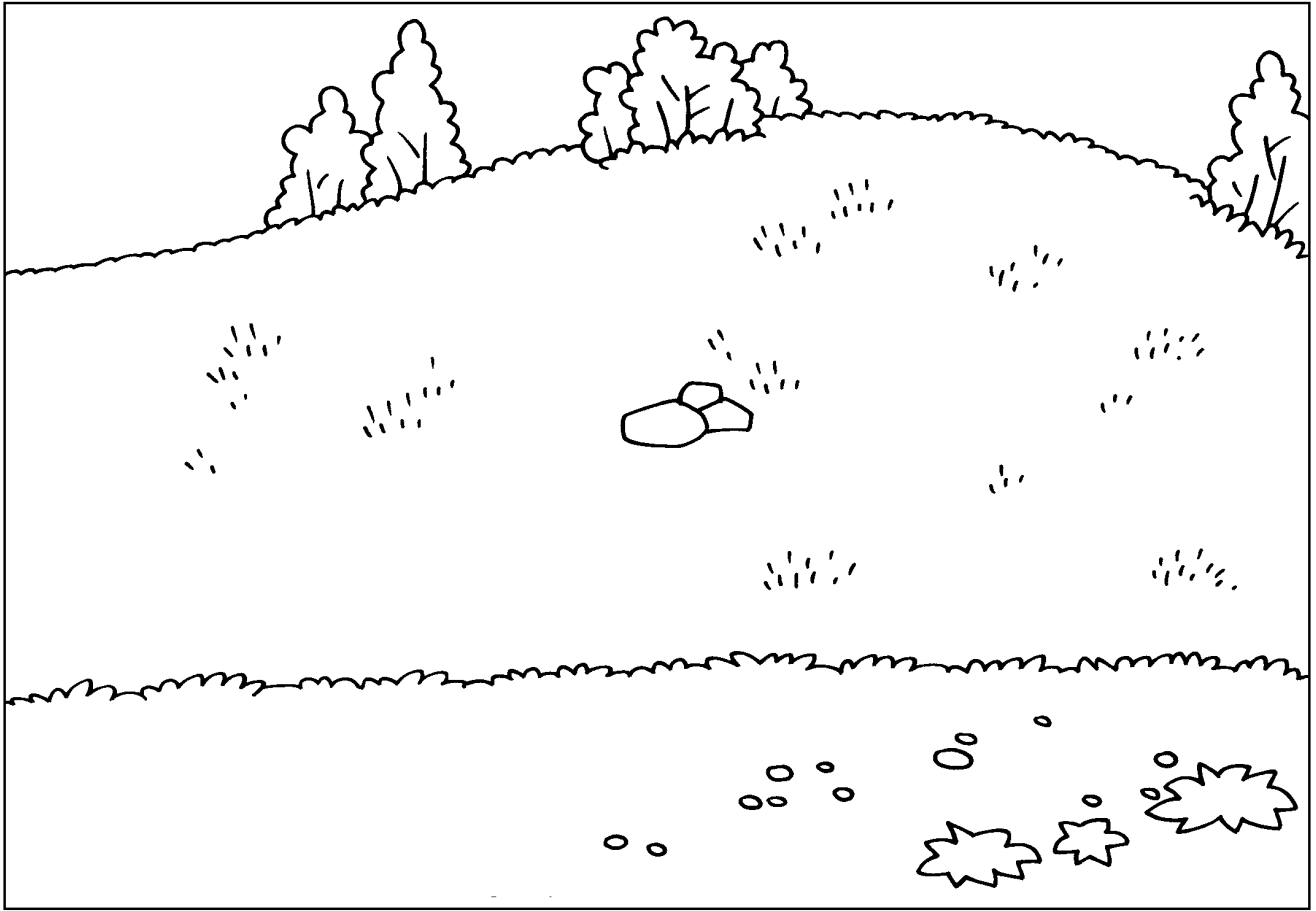
Don't ever feel that what you have to give to Jesus is too small. Jesus can do great things with your gifts to Him!

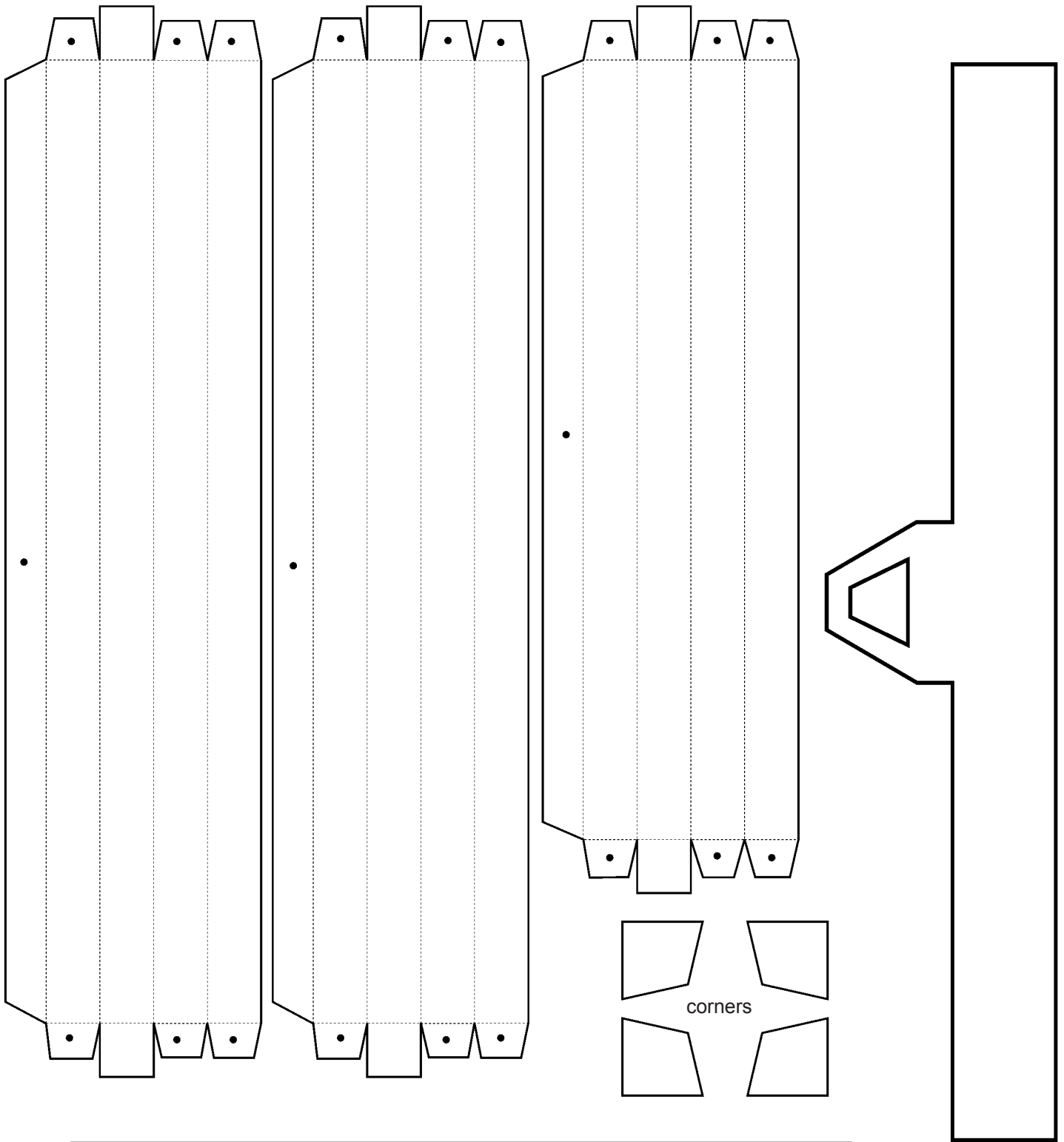
